Users of the Statement of General Fund Cash Receipts and Disbursements

Attached are the Statements of General Fund Cash Receipts and Disbursements for the period July 1, 2004 through May 31, 2005. These statements reflect the State of California's General Fund cash position and compare actual receipts and disbursements for the 2004-05 fiscal year to cash flow estimates prepared by the Department of Finance for the 2005-06 May Revision as well as the 2004-05 Budget Act. These statements are prepared in compliance with Government Code section 12461.1, as well as Item 0840-001-0001, Provision 10, of the 2004-05 Budget Act, using records compiled by the State Controller.

Attachment A compares actual receipts and disbursements to date for the 2004-05 fiscal year to cash flow estimates published in the 2005-06 May Revision. The May Revision cash flow reflects an expected increase of \$6.7 billion in receipts, and an expected decrease of \$192 million in disbursements from the Budget Act estimate for the 2004-05 fiscal year. These cash flow estimates are predicated on projections and assumptions made by the Department of Finance in preparation of the May Revision.

Attachment B compares actual receipts and disbursements to date for the 2004-05 fiscal year to cash flow estimates prepared by the Department of Finance based upon the 2004-05 Budget Act. Prior year actual amounts are also displayed for comparative purposes.
