


# 2023-24 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report is officially published!

SCO is executing a multi-year phased approach in collaboration with California Departments to identify and remediate root causes impacting the ACFR process.

Goal: Return to on-time ACFR publication by March 31, 2026. Encourage departments to meet deadlines, leverage support, and help California achieve best-in-class financial management.

## California State Payroll Project (CSPS)



### **Biweekly Pay**



Consistent two-week (14-day) pay periods, totaling 26 periods per year.



Regular and overtime hours combined into a single, streamlined paycheck.



Payroll processed in arrears, providing greater accuracy.



The shift to biweekly pay will align with your department's implementation of the California State Payroll System.

### **PLANNING**

The planning phase began with a March contract awarded to CGI Technologies & Solutions, focusing on vendor onboarding, implementation planning; and design, development, configuration, and implementation (DDCI) preparation.

#### **EXECUTION**

Each phase covers DDCI and multiple waves of departmental rollouts. The first rollout is targeted to go live in May 2028, with maintenance starting for each department as it goes live.

#### **MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS**

This final phase continues operations, offboards contractors, and captures lessons learned.
